A: What's up, Brenda?

B: Me too. I'll see you later!

A: Ok. See you later!

Dialogue 5:

A: Hello, Sandra. How are you today?

B: Hi, Maria. I feel sick today. I'm going to leave work early.

A: I'm sorry. I hope you feel better. I'll see you tomorrow.

B: Thank you. I'll see you tomorrow.
